

Family Services is comprised of two components – social services and parent involvement.

Social services include recruiting families for our programs – Early Head Start, Head Start, and Pre-K Counts that serve families prenatal until age 5 throughout Somerset County. We seek applications for children along with age and income verification. Applications are screened with a rating sheet, categorized, selected, or placed on a waiting list which is used when a vacancy occurs.

Our Specialists, Cheri, Carol and Jill track daily attendance. Also, they make home visits, link families to needed services, and help families with goal planning. They can provide a listening ear for families.

The second component is parent involvement. Parents can participate by volunteering in the classroom or doing activities sent home by the staff. Also, they can attend parent meetings, come to Celebrations of Learning, and/or become a Policy Council representative.

This "time" is considered in-kind. It is a match of 25% of our budget that come in the form of in-kind which is something given to the program; donated time, floor space, and items. This is documented by signing our green in-kind sheet and is tallied monthly and submitted to the Federal government. The toothbrushing calendar and "I am Moving, I am Learning" activity sheet, when completed, can count toward this in-kind match.



This is the second year for our parenting program, Ready Rosie. Every Monday you should be receiving a video via text or email. These are short (approx. 2 min) and are helpful suggestions and hints that can be useful to parents. Please take the time to view these.

These services range from early intervention therapies to behavior health services to nursing care. I then work with our families to complete the referral process, make sure the services are provided effectively in our classrooms, and that the support follows the student to kindergarten when appropriate.

I have dedicated 22 years to Tableland's Early Childhood Education Department. Currently I supervise Early Head Start (EHS). Our EHS home-based program is facilitated by 5 amazing Home Visitors. Through weekly home visits they encourage families' self-sufficiency and support their knowledge of child development.

Twice a month, families come together for social interactions. This is a time to learn and grow together as a community with common interests—young children.

We are proud to share that in the first 3 months of the school year our families have grown by 4 babies and our home visitors have supported parents who have acquired needed food, clothing and shelter, improved their own education, gained needed educational services for their child, navigated the child custody system, improved their employment, and so much more!

A special shout out to 3 of our home visitors who have enrolled in an intensive certification program, Safe Care, to gain knowledge of yet another research-based curriculum which will assist them in their work with families.

We strive to ensure that, through collaboration among families, staff, and health professionals, all student's health concerns are identified. Our goal is to make sure students and families are linked to an ongoing source of continuous, accessible care to meet their basic health needs. During the school year we visit each classroom in the fall and spring to assess the student's growth (height and weight). Within the first 45 days of the school year we conduct hearing and vision screenings.





It may look like scribbles to you, but my scribbles are very important to me. Scribbling allows me to be creative and use my imagination. I am developing the muscles I need to write.
